Come visit a true living lighthouse, and experience a keepers life as it would have been at the turn of the 20th century.

To provide greater flexibility in meeting your schedule, for the summer of 2012, we will be offering St. Helena Experience” excursions every Monday and Friday between June 25 and August 3.

On each of these dates, the Coast Guard approved vessel CAKE & ICE CREAM will depart the Mackinaw City Marina at 9:00 a.m. and transport you and the other guests and volunteers

beneath the Mighty Mackinac Bridge, and westbound through the Straits of Mackinac to the remote and pristine beauty of St. Helena Island.

Volunteers will await your arrival on the island, where they will greet you with a plate of tasty “St. Helena Welcome Mints”, and will transport you back in time to 1912.

After lunch in the lighthouse, you will have a couple of hours to tour the lighthouse from top to bottom, experience the beauty of the island,

throw a few horseshoes, take a short hike to the old village site, or sew a quilt patch on the treadle sewing machine.

For 2012, the price for this opportunity to experience “The Miracle in The Straits” has been reduce to \$80.00 per person, plus the cost of GLLKA membership for non-members.
